A minimum mark of 50% will be required for all assessments in both modules in order to

successfully comply with the assessment criteria to pass the certificate and to be awarded the

certificate.

6. Accreditation

This course is designed, delivered and assessed at the level of a 6-credit HEQF (2007) level 5 course.

The courseis aimed at participants with a National Senior Certificate, approved and controlled as

required by the South African qualifications Authority (SAQA).

This course is currently not officially accredited and on completion successful candidates will be

provided with an official certificate issued by Hugenote Kollege.
